WHAT A WONDERFUL OCTOBER WELCA HAD! Thanks to all of you for helping us, which in turn will assist our community and the people who are in need of our services and supplies. A special thank you to the Lutheran World Relief (LWR) committee members: Linda Johnson, LeAnn Everhart, Nancy Hopp, Diane Talbott and JoAn Lindfors.



The LWR committee, along with the awesome assistance of Elim's Youth Group, packed up and boxed items on Wednesday, October 9 for our Lutheran World Relief kits. They also boxed quilts made by Elim's Quilting Group, and tied blankets made by the Youth Group. In total, there were 12 personal care kits, 12 baby kits, 5 tied blankets, and at least 16 quilts boxed up for mailing. Nancy Hopp and Linda Johnson mailed the boxes the next morning to help all those persons needing and awaiting our church's assistance. We should be very proud of this continued work for the Lutheran World Relief. Some monies from WELCA's treasury was used to complete the kits. WELCA did well in its recent fundraisers. In August, they raised \$198 selling monster cookies, cookbooks, and dishcloths at Marquette's 145<sup>th</sup> Celebration; and an additional \$54 for cookie sales at the Hanson-Lindfors Mansion tours, which raised \$600 (split between WELCA and the Marquette Celebration Committee).

**WELCA hosted the Riverview Singalong on October 20**, with special music by Darren Able. The residents always love having children perform! Darren is the son of Beth Thomas, and not a child anymore (with children of his own!), but it's still fun to have our "children" share their talents with the residents. Whenever possible, please ensure your children are "on the ark". They learn so much from their time in Sunday School.
