Greetings, Elim –

I hope you are well in all ways as this July Messenger reaches you.

At the writing of this article, more people in our area of Kansas are testing positive for the coronavirus and our reopening has been slowed. As everything is fluid these days, perhaps this reality has changed by the time you read these words. I hope this is the case! I'm just guessing there will have been new news and we will have had to renegotiate our behaviors again.

Awhile back I preached about how important anchors are for us as human beings. I think they are worth revisiting now.

Anchors are important any ol' time for us as humans and they are extremely important for us during times of uncertainty and change. Wondering about scheduled upcoming events, thinking of family members who have complicating health concerns, contemplating the upcoming school year, work... there is a lot of uncertainty these days. We are needing to be more flexible and adaptable than most of us have experienced in our lives. In the midst of this, we are needing to worship differently. We are outdoors or online or inside and spaced out without singing or whatever else we have had to come up with... We get to worship God together which is the most important thing, but it is different. Anchors. We need them. Big time.

We Christians have many anchors that can hold us to God. We have scriptures that are beautiful, and we can memorize a few verses to have in the back of our minds at all times. I love the Psalms: God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble (46) and, God will keep your going out and your coming in from this time on and forevermore (121). There are dozens that are lovely with which to anchor ourselves to God when we are feeling off.

Another anchor for me is singing. I love the oldies and find myself singing, quite poorly but with gusto, "His Eye Is on the Sparrow" and "It Is Well with My Soul". Perhaps good, familiar songs are an anchor for you too. If so, may we sing!

We can also meditate, journal, make lists and whatever else helps us; the important thing is that we do these things for ourselves. If we don't think we have the time to do these types of things, then we probably need to spend twice as much time with them.

Let's recognize that in these different times of uncertainty and change, we need to anchor ourselves into God more than ever. We will be better for it and those around us will benefit as well.

Fifty years later we celebrate the anniversary as a whole church. The influence of those decisions 50 years ago is not merely the impact on women. This is a celebration for the whole church, because the whole church has been strengthened by the gifts of ordained women in its leadership. We celebrate how these pastors have shared the Word, including with words of compassion, conviction, and curiosity. We also give thanks for the moments when there are no word, but they have offered their presence...

In recognition of this 5<sup>th</sup> anniversary on June 29, I invite you to express gratitude to a pastor who is a woman for how she has influenced your life. It could be by letter or email, or by other means. If you post on social media, please use the hashtag **#thankyoupastor...**

Fifty years after 1970, we also live in a world beset by change. I am grateful for the Spirit who continues to lead us and for the women God has called to minister to us. I thank God for all of you who minister so faithfully.
