A Message from Pastor Amy Kay...

Sometimes it's comforting to know that we aren't going crazy. (Perhaps I'm projecting here and I'm the only one who wonders if I'm losing my mind on occasion.) If you've struggled to remember when something happened in the past year or are surprised at what week of the month it is, I'm with you. I've learned that there is such a thing as a 'pandemic time warp' in which our brains experience a muddling of the sense of time. It's normal. Whew!

As we emerge from the pandemic, we might experience more disorientation. It's never comfortable to be disoriented, but there is a measure of comfort in recognizing that it is normal. Certainly our comfort level with how we emerge will differ from one another just as our comfort levels during the pandemic have differed. Some of us might be ready to throw a dance party complete with a rented disco ball as soon as we are vaccinated, while others will feel more comfortable continuing to be physically distant. These differences and our feelings about them will be easier to deal with if we can step back from it all and recognize that this is all normal. It is to be expected. We are not going crazy. Our neighbor is not going crazy. (Probably.) The best thing we can do is to continue having grace for ourselves, have grace for one another and allow some time to pass.

Your Church Council has diligently tried to hold all of our differences in balance while deciding how to move along this past year. They have also had to balance me in that mix. I can't think of a more difficult time since I started serving a church over twenty years ago in which a Council has served. Dana Olson didn't really want to be the Council president this last year and I asked/begged him to stay on for some consistency as I was just beginning my time with you. He kindly agreed and shortly thereafter came the pandemic. Please join me in thanking Dana and the whole Council for their time, emotional energy and effort. They have had a lot to deal with and have handled it all really well. I'm so glad to have gotten to serve with them. Please join me in welcoming our new Council as well. Their leadership continues to be extremely important and I'm looking forward to a good year ahead with them.

Having said all of this, when Gayle asked about our Lenten services this week, I nearly fell out of my chair! Already?! Yes, indeed. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on February 17. We are joining with Lacey and our good United Methodist neighbors for sure and are reaching out to Freemount to see if they want to join in as well this year. Clearly we are still working out all the details, but we know we will have our own Ash Wednesday services so that we can meet in person. We are thinking through how we can still offer collaborative Wednesday evening services through the season and may stream these opportunities. We will communicate through our website, Sunday morning worship services and Facebook about all of the ways we can deepen our faith through the Lent. I pray for a meaningful, helpful season of reflection for us all. We will do our best to create experiences that will foster this possibility.

Christian Education: No meeting. Diane Hedberg will discuss when to resume Sunday School with Tammy Feil.

Property: No meeting. Dana Olson will get bids for the carpet tiles, to include installation, with possibility of getting council

approval for congregational vote at annual meeting.

Memorial: No meeting. Diane Hedberg will notify Janis Larson that council approved WiFi upgrade, to be paid through

Memorial Fund.

Security Committee: No report.

Next meeting to be held on Monday, February 1, 2021.



WELCA NEWS

Year 2020 started out very normal. January and February of 2020 started with the officers for WELCA, JoAn Lindfors, President; Diane Talbott, Vice-President; Jackie Larson, Secretary; and Cindy Bunk, Treasurer, in their second year as officers. WELCA loved having Pastor Amy Kay at our first meeting in January, and having her so interested in all we did for Elim since she became Elim's pastor in 2019.

Pastor continued to join us for Sing-alongs, and we planned for many "special events" for **Riverview Estates in 2020**, including the Sing-alongs each third Sunday of the month with Jackie Larson playing piano; Brooke Olson and JoAn Lindfors leading the singing, and the Birthday Parties on the last Friday of each month. In February, WELCA gave signed Valentine cards to each resident along with goodies inside colorful bags. Other activities were planned, but on **March 13, 2020**, an American pandemic caused by Covid-19 was announced by the USA President Trump, and sadly all the physical activities and visits to Riverview Estates ceased. WELCA didn't want the residents to think we weren't thinking and praying for them, so we continued after March to remember female residents in May for Mother's Day, and in June for Father's Day for the male residents, with cards and small gifts and candy. WELCA also sent cards to any resident we knew who was ill. Unfortunately the birthday parties each last Friday of the month were only done in January and February, and couldn't be done through the remainder of the year. WELCA doesn't know yet when the Sing-alongs and birthday parties can begin again.

WELCA Sunday (where the women conduct the worship service), plus a fundraising breakfast, had been planned for March 22, 2020, but Covid-19 forced us to cancel that event, along with Confirmation Sunday. WELCA did provide flowers for the families of the two confirmands, but the Parish Hall coffee hour had to be cancelled because of the virus.

WELCA respected the CDC guidelines and safety precautions, but continued to do special projects, which included:

- 1) <u>"40 Day Fast for Lent"</u>, which was giving up one item each day of Lent and placing it in a trash bag. Members filled 18 bags, which were delivered to various charities in McPherson and Salina. There may have been more bags, but the congregation was asked to deliver the bags themselves because of the virus precautions.
- 2) <u>Lutheran World Relief Kits</u> were assembled even with the limited group meetings, to include 12 personal care kits, 12 baby kits, and quilts done by Donna Patrick and her committee... The kits were packed with the help of the youth group, and brought to Salina to be shipped to World Relief. A special thanks goes to Nancy Hopp for all the shopping of needed items for the kits, and the committee's leader, Linda Johnson. Many members couldn't go shopping so they donated monies, raising nearly \$300.
- 3) <u>"Thanksgiving Blessing Boxes"</u>, which entailed putting 24 food items in a box and contributing them to families in Marquette. Pastor Amy Kay volunteered and did a good job delivering nine (9) boxes to various families in the area.
- 4) "Christmas Angel Boxes", which included the same list as the Thanksgiving Blessing Boxes. There were four (4) boxes delivered again by Pastor Amy Kay. The boxes were truly needed to the families who received them. WELCA got an urgent plea for food from the McPherson Food Bank during this pandemic time, stating that requests from families has been very high for the year. WELCA officers voted to donate \$100 to McPherson Food Bank in May, but then Vice-President Diane Talbott had an even better idea. She suggested that WELCA could help the Food Bank and our local Pipers Fine Food if we purchased food from Pipers and took it to the McPherson Food Bank. Word got around and two anonymous donations of \$100 and \$25 were added to the purchases -- so WELCA ended up giving \$325.00 worth of groceries to McPherson Food Bank.

5) Operation Christmas Child. A project of Freemount church, Gayle Nelson asked Elim and WELCA to support the project, and it was voted to do so. Baskets were located in the church and Parish Hall for the items listed monthly in Elim's bulletin and Messenger. Gayle then took the responsibility to get them delivered to Freemount for assembly in November. Once again, collection of items became slower in the months after the Elim church was not open because of the Covid pandemic. Elim will support the efforts again in 2021. The list of items needed each month for these Christmas boxes of 2021 is already listed in the January MESSENGER.

The treasury for WELCA in 2020 started out much better than the start of 2019 (\$504.00). Even without the fundraiser in March, the treasury stayed at over \$2,000.00 for most of 2020. Therefore, WELCA officers decided that, since so many charities and agencies were hurting because of the strong demands of people who had been affected by the Covid-19 virus, more donations would be given to assist them. Donations were given to:

- a) "Bethlehem Revisited" \$200.00 donation. 34 Elim members had attended this special event in December, 2019. It was free with donations accepted. It had to be cancelled in 2020, but hopefully it will be able to reconvene in 2021.
- b) Ashby House, Salina \$100 in January & \$125 in December.
- c) <u>Mt. Hope Sanctuary, McPherson</u> Brooke Olson requested WELCA donate to this charity and WELCA gave \$100 in August & \$125 in December.
- d) Rescue Mission, Salina \$100 in January.
- e) <u>Child Safety and Drug Education Program</u> (McPherson Sheriff's Department that uses materials to keep children safe and drug free) **\$125 in December provided kits for 50 children.**
- f) Pastor Amy Kay \$25.00 WELCA learned that the day after Mother's Day in May, 2020 was Amy Kay's birthday. In appreciation and love for all she does for Elim, WELCA started a "grocery fund" at Pipers Fine Foods and anyone who wanted to add to that fund could do so. We also organized a parade of cars through Pastor's alley in Lindsborg --- honking horns, showing banners, and remaining "social distanced" in cars. It was a surprise visit for her, and she posted it on the Elim FB site. It was so much fun.

Even with donations, no fundraiser, and the cancellation of Elim's Swedish supper in December, 2020, the treasury's end balance for WELCA's 2020 year stands at \$1,263.50. Cindy Bunk, Treasurer, has a breakdown in her report.

It turned out to be a pretty busy 2020 for WELCA, but with real limitations because of the pandemic. No physical Executive Board meetings were conducted after the February meeting. Officers communicated through text and phone calls. All the officers agreed to continue their two-year terms for 2021-2022. We are praying that the next years will allow more physical gatherings. Thank you for continuing to be involved at arms-length and with financial support. It is truly appreciated.
