VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL



Elim is sponsoring VBS this year, with Pastor Amy Kay leading it. It will take place June 7 through June 9 from 9:00 AM- Noon. Kids age 5 through the completion of 5th grade are invited to participate. The theme of this year's event is "On Earth as in Heaven", based on The Lord's Prayer. There will be games, crafts, storytelling, and small group times as we learn and grow together.

Most of the activities will be outside or in large spaces. Snacks will be prepackaged and will be eaten outside if weather permits. Masks are suggested but not mandatory. Please send a water bottle with your child each day to minimize use of the water fountain and/or disposable cup usage.

Children will be grouped by age/grade completed and will have a small group leader as well as the activity leaders at each station. Our hope is to provide a safe, fun, enlightening experience for each person who is involved in VBS. The Lord's Prayer is a great one from which to learn!

WELCA remembered the eighteen (18) females of Riverview Estates on Mother's Day by giving them greeting cards and vases of flowers. The flowers included fresh "snowballs" from the Lindfors's yard. The staff reported back that each resident was thrilled with the fresh flowers and cards. Next month we will remember the male residents for Father's Day.

WELCA also wanted to remember Pastor Amy Kay on her birthday May 11, so a card with monies was sent to her. We are so grateful for her guidance and dedication to Elim and the congregation. Pastor is always so inspiring with her ideas and love for Elim and the Marquette community. Let's continue to thank her.

As reported last month, Riverview Estates is beginning to open up, and WELCA was hoping and praying that Sing-alongs would be able to start in June. However, Dori Weber indicated that they would probably have to delay it another month, and that it would take place in the activity room at Riverview rather than the front room as you enter the facility. This will enable the residents and "singers" to be socially distanced, and masks will be recommended. Dori also indicated that it would be better to do another day of the week – NOT Sundays – because there is not sufficient staff on the weekend to help with residents and check in visitors. If any of you have a day that might work, or after work so that more can attend, WELCA welcomes your suggestions or ideas.

Our Riverview Estates birthday parties are still on hold. As we related to you last month, Dori suggested we rename the birthday parties as "tea parties", and hold them at 1:00 PM on the last Friday of the month. Because food cannot be brought in to Riverview Estates yet, Riverview will provide a bagged treat instead of the usual desserts. The "tea party" is to promote visits for the residents. The residents are so much happier when they have visitors. Please consider visiting a resident or two at Riverview. You will need to call Riverview first for permission to visit, as they are only allowed so many visitors per day, but it is well worth the effort.

Here it is almost summer 2021. There are many volunteers needed for the summer lunch program and mowing. There are many more responsibilities gradually beginning again -such as lectors, greeters, and acolytes - so please come back to worship in the sanctuary and help out as much as you can. We will get there IF everyone respects the limitations that are still recommended for Elim by the CDC guidelines. Stay safe. Stay healthy.

One of our continued projects is with Freemount Lutheran Church's Christmas Shoeboxes. WELCA thanks Gayle Nelson for continuing to take charge of Elim's contributions to this project for 2021. ~ CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES ~

Church Council –Met May 3, 2021. Discussed plans for Patriotic Sunday May 30. Pastor Amy Kay presented information provided by ELCA on security concerns and awareness. She reported on the status of her full approval by ELCA synod as pastor at Elim. A congregational vote will be held May 23 to finalize the process required by synod to fully recognize Pastor Amy Kay as Elim’s pastor. [Congregational vote May 23: members voted unanimously to accept Pastor Amy Kay as pastor of Elim]. Council approved returning to use of lectors and greeters for worship service. Elim will be hosting VBS this summer. Pastor Amy Kay will be leading the 3-day event in June.

Worship & Music: No meeting. Allan Lindfors is working on special music for the summer.

Finance & Stewardship: No meeting.

Memorial Committee: Plan to meet May 12. Allan Lindfors requested new hearing devices for use in the sanctuary.

Evangelism/ Social Ministry: No meeting.

Christian Education: No meeting. Diane Hedberg reported that May 30 will be the last day of Sunday School. Carly Peterson asked permission for Youth Group to attend paintballing in Assaria in June.

Property/Security Committee: Carpet installation for the Parish Hall is scheduled for May 10. Sandy Edwards arranged for a covered trailer owned by Cole Case to be used to store tables, chairs, and other items from the Parish Hall during the course of the installation.

Next meeting to be held on Monday, June 7, 2021.


