I hope this newsletter finds you at peace and with joy after the Advent and Christmas seasons.



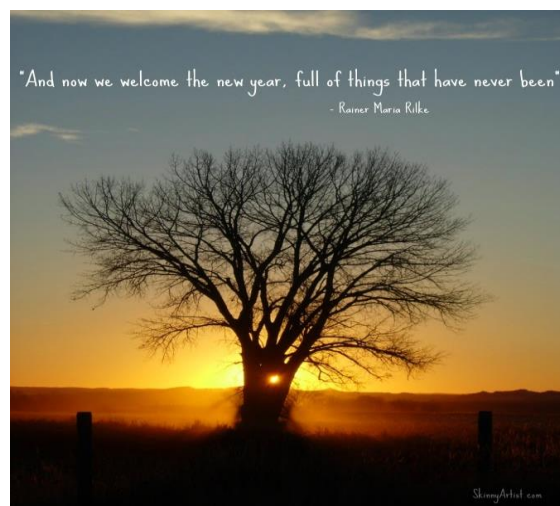
Oddly, we ended 2021 and began 2022 with the same gospel reading this year: the story of the Wise Men traveling to the baby Jesus. I've never repeated a scripture before, but there is plenty to reflect upon with the story of Jesus' birth... and I didn't want to follow the lectionary because Jesus would have been 12 years old the day after Christmas! That seemed ludicrous. Jesus would have been born, turned 12 and then the Sunday after was only a few weeks old again. We are certainly capable of hearing the stories in whatever order we wish, but I just couldn't do it this year.

I wonder if my emotional revulsion at the twelve-year-jump-in-a-day had something to do with the last couple of years. It seems my/our prayers for presence and peace became more fervent. We've had medical uncertainty, distrust, frustration and interruption. Some of us have had loss and grief related to and unrelated, but greatly affected by, the pandemic. Through it all, we've prayed to God for peace, justice and openness to God's guidance. We've talked about being present and full of God's grace for ourselves and one another.

As we begin 2022 together, let's continue to pray for all of these things and especially our ability to be present in each of God's moments. We can experience peace in this conscientious effort. I'm not suggesting we kick back in our easy chairs and be satisfied watching the world go by. By centering ourselves in the present with God, we will have the orientation and energy to press on to justice that brings hope for all people. Isn't that fascinating? It is when we are the most centered that we have the most direction and energy to be about God's work in the world. Let's let this be our call into the new year together.

It will be good to live on together as church in 2022.

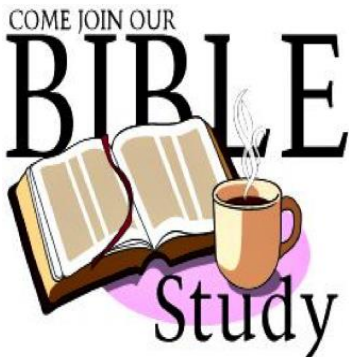

**Annual Meeting of the Congregation – Minutes**

**Elim Lutheran Church, Marquette, KS**

**January 31, 2021**

**Meeting to Order:** Dana Olson, Church Council President, called the meeting to order at 11:45 AM. Approximately 28 members attended.

**Devotions:** Pastor Amy Kay Pavlovich opened the meeting with prayer.

**Approval of 2020 Annual Meeting Minutes (held January 26, 2020):** Allan Lindfors moved and Andi Willems seconded that the 2020 Annual Meeting minutes be approved as submitted. The motion passed unopposed.

**Report from the Nominating Committee:** There are currently four (4) positions open on the Church Council. Scott Johnson presented the following candidates: Beth Thomas, Sandy Edwards, Janis Larson, and Carly Peterson. Diane Hedberg moved and Patty Kolling seconded to accept the nominations as presented. The motion passed.

**Election of Council Members:** Council members elected in 2021 to serve for 3 years will be Beth Thomas, Sandy Edwards, Janis Larson, and Carly Peterson.

**Election of Memorial Committee:** Committee members include Janis Larson, Diane Hedberg, Diane Talbott, Dorine Cunningham, Cindy Bunk, Charlotte Knackstedt, Pam Morel and Vicki Young. It was agreed by consensus to accept current committee members for 2021.

**Election of Nominating Committee:** Scott Johnson suggested one additional member be added to the committee to replace Matt Hedberg. Julie Olson volunteered to fill the position. Jeremy Snapp moved and Andi Willems seconded to accept the nominating committee as it stands with the addition of Julie Olson. The motion passed unopposed.

Members of the committee for 2021 are Scott Johnson, Brooke Olson, Mike Hulse, Rita Brown, and Julie Olson.

**Appointment of Auditing Committee Member:** Dana Olson thanked the audit committee (Marci Fox, Susan Buffington, and Sandra Myers) for their service in 2020. JoAnn Lindfors moved and Steve Patrick seconded to accept the current committee members for 2021. The motion passed unopposed.

**Reports:**

**Pastor's Report:** Pastor Amy Kay Pavlovich thanked the members leaving council for serving the church: Dana Olson as president, Patty Kolling, Lana Rock, and Scott Feil.

**Council's Report:** Dana Olson added that "we have got to come back to church", encouraging members to attend worship on a regular basis and to become involved with the various committees and events.

**Committee Reports:**

**Christian Ed.:** Diane Hedberg reported that Sunday School will resume February 7 at 10:15-10:45 AM, pending council approval on February 1, 2021. Sunday School will remain in the single open classroom through May, with Diane Hedberg and Tammy Feil conducting the Bible lessons.

**Youth Group:** Dana Olson thanked Lars and Carly Peterson for serving as youth sponsors.

**Memorial Committee:** No further discussion. Dana Olson reported that a \$1500 gift was received from the family of Marlin and Marilyn Young.

**Property Committee:** Scott Johnson reported that the Parish Hall flooring will be the next big project, at approximately \$10,000 cost. Council approved the bid. A congregational vote of members present approved the expenditure. Dana Olson offered the old folding tables from the Parish Hall for free to any members interested.

**WELCA:** JoAn Lindfors reported on donations and projects in 2020. She stated that she appreciates everyone's help and donations. Jackie Larson thanked JoAn for her leadership, especially during Covid, and added that JoAn handled many of the tasks herself and kept it going.

**Worship and Music:** Dana Olson thanked Allan Lindfors for his many years of leadership as choir director [it will be 50 years this month, January 2021].

**Security:** Dana Olson reported that the new Parish Hall doors with panic (crash) bars enhances safety and security. Jeremy Snapp reported that MTC fiber-enhanced WiFi will improve internet connection, including security cameras.

**Financial Report:** Dana Olson stated that he was thankful for the church outreach despite Covid via the online services. He noted that the Swedish Supper Committee were considering changes to the preparations and other facets of the traditional fundraiser. He thanked members and their families for giving to the church.

**New Business:**

- **Adoption of 2021 Budget:** Scott Johnson presented the proposed budget approved by council. He noted the increases, and that the cut in utilities due to less usage of the church building lowered the budget costs marginally. Jeremy Snapp mentioned the new budgeted item for the service fee for processing electronic giving, which had not been noted previously. Darren Able moved and Linda Johnson seconded to approve the 2021 proposed budget as submitted. The motion passed.

**Blessings and Gratitude Moments:** Dana Olson thanked members (Pastor Amy Kay Pavlovich, Jackie Larson, Allan Lindfors, Linda Johnson, Diane Hedberg, Beth Thomas, and Gayle Nelson) who do so much. He read a quote from Tony Dungy re: being a part of the one team. He again pleaded for members to come to church.

**Adjournment with Prayer:** Pastor Amy Kay ended the meeting in prayer. Patty Kolling moved and Andi Willems seconded that the meeting be adjourned at 12:30 PM. The motion passed unopposed.
