



## ADULT BIBLE STUDY



Julie Olson has been presenting segments of the TV series “The Chosen” for a once-monthly Bible study during the summer. The next session will be August 7 at 9:30 AM in the Parish Hall.

No matter where you are in your journey with Jesus Christ, this TV show is for you! Imagine you could see the life of Jesus through the eyes of the people that walked on earth with him – the disciples, Mary his mother, the Pharisees, the children, those he healed. What would that look like? Now you can experience it! “The Chosen” is the first-ever multi-season TV show about the life of Jesus. Created outside of the Hollywood system, “The Chosen” allows us to see Him through the eyes of those who knew him.

“The Chosen” stays faithful to the Gospels and at the same time tells us a story that is in between the lines of scripture. This TV series brings to life those people that are mentioned in the Bible, using the historical context of life at the time of Jesus. The series does not contradict scripture, but instead puts life around it so that we as viewers can imagine, “What was life like with Jesus.” Our hope is that as our church encounters the characters in “The Chosen”, we are able to relate to them, leading us in a closer relationship with Jesus, our Lord and Savior. “The Chosen” is a fresh look at the Gospels for those who have been reading the stories for years or for those who are just curious about who Jesus is and was.

Julie says “We hope as you encounter the characters in ‘The Chosen’ on the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of every month you will build a new curiosity about the life of Jesus and those that followed him when he walked the earth. This series has the potential to give a better understanding of Jesus as God and man. All are invited to come join us!”
