Greetings, Elim –

I hope this month's newsletter finds you healthy and feeling filled with the Spirit!

In worship on Sunday, July 24 I focused on Paul's directive of being "rooted" in Christ together. It is a beautiful image and is used often in our scriptures. I'm not going to rehash all of the amazing rooting that happens in forests, but will reiterate this point: trees seem to *know* they are individually healthier when all the trees in the forest are healthy so they help each other through their roots. The big trees take care of the little saplings that don't get enough light by passing sugar through their root hairs. The big trees even help the failed trees if their roots stay connected. Trees build each other up.

Let's be like a healthy forest.

Each Sunday morning at 11am we get together and worship God. We pray, listen, think, sing and are a community rooted together in our God. We continue growing.

Sunday School will be starting on September 11. There is a need for teachers (see related article). Let's feed the little saplings.

"God's Work. Our Hands." is an opportunity for all ELCA churches to dive into service projects on September 11. After church that day we will have lunch and then take on a project in the community and one inside the church. Let's build each other up.

What additional parallels can you make between Elim and a healthy forest? In what ways could we more fully live into Paul's directive to be rooted together in Christ?

Lastly, one time recently a friend snarled that a neighbor must think she is God's gift to the world. I responded, "well, she kind of is, isn't she?" It wasn't my most eloquent moment, but hopefully the idea managed to come through.

I think we are all:

- complicated people
- doing the best we can
- gifted by God
- capable of growing into more healthy reflections of God

So let's be like the trees and build each other up since we are all in this together. When we have the inkling to get a good dig in on someone (who deserves it, gosh darn it!), let's try to remember our humanness and extend grace. If that isn't enough, let's also remember that the forest is less healthy if a tree within is hurt. If one person is hurt, the community is hurt so we might as well not cut one another down. Let's look for the good in one another and voice our appreciation.

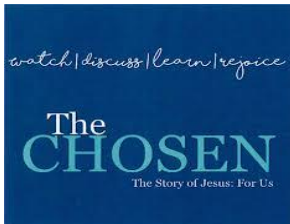

CONGREGATIONAL VOTE

Elim members voted on the redesign of the choir room and front foyer area on Sunday, July 24. The purpose of the redesign is to provide a welcoming space for pastoral visits, and a comfortable waiting area for members and visitors entering the Parish Hall. Curtis Patrick, Council President, called the meeting to order. WELCA presented the plans and the bid for the project. The project is not to exceed \$9000. Funds for the project will be taken from the Improvement & Renovation Account and/or the Improvement Money Market Account. Labor for any construction or painting needed will be provided free of charge by members Beau Boughfman, Terry Hopp, and Allan Lindfors. The choir room will continue to be available for the choir robes and the quilting supplies. WELCA members realized the need for a quiet space for Pastor Amy Kay to meet with individuals and groups, since she currently has no office or private space at the church. Lois Johnson moved and Patty Kolling seconded to approve the redesign. The motion passed. Curtis Patrick adjourned the meeting.

July 5, 2022

Council will meet August 29 rather than August 1, and combine it with the September meeting previously scheduled for September 6.
