YOUTH GROUP MISSION TRIP IN 2023

The Youth Group is planning a mission trip to Nashville, Tennessee March 12-18, 2023. According to Lars and Carly Peterson, Youth Group sponsors, they will be working with CSM Nashville. CSM is a nationwide Christian non-profit organization that focuses on serving those in need in urban areas, spreading the Gospel, and helping youth volunteers grow in their faith in the process. The organization was recommended to them by a pastor and a parent of one of their youth group.

CSM Nashville will provide meals, housing, and coordinate their mission work with approximately 30 local ministries and non-profits that they partner with. Examples of the work they will be doing: serving at soup kitchens, working at homeless shelters, and preparing medical supply shipments for countries in need.

In order to attend the mission trip, members of the Youth Group will be required to acolyte at least 4 times, help with 3 of the 4 planned fundraisers, actively participate in church functions, and volunteer to help with projects. They also plan to play games with Riverview residents at least once a month. The cost per person for the trip will be \$459.00. They will be conducting fundraisers to raise money toward the cost and have asked for donations from the Memorial Committee (who gifted \$2000) and from WELCA.

For the month of October, they will be selling meat bundles from Yoder Meats. The fundraiser begins October 4 and runs through October 26. Orders will be delivered in late November or early December. 
