Recently I learned of Jordan Romero who is the youngest person to climb Mount Everest at 13 and then the youngest to climb all seven summits across the continents at 15 years of age. What caught my attention



more than his persistence and ability to climb is that he apparently understood at a young age that not everyone's goals are the same as his nor should they be. May we be open and active seekers of what God calls us to this month. May we be ready for what is beyond our current understanding of the possible.



NOTES FROM CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING

October 3, 2022

Council discussed the Youth Group Mission Trip scheduled for March 12-18, 2023. The group will be working with CSM Nashville, a nationwide Christian non-profit organization that focuses on serving those in need in urban areas. The Youth Group will be holding fundraisers to help pay the cost. Council approved a sound system upgrade for an additional speaker for the south side of the church.

Worship & Music: Met September 28. Adding back the noise offering on 2nd Sunday of the month, starting Nov. 13.

Finance & Stewardship: No meeting.

Memorial Committee: No meeting. Donated \$2000 to the Youth Group for the mission trip.

<u>Christian Ed</u>: No meeting. Diane Hedberg and Tammy Feil will continue group teaching through October, with SS teachers assisting.

Evangelism/Social Ministry: No meeting.

Property/Security Committee: Discussed replacing the front doors to the sanctuary. May require metal or composite doors to protect from weather. Purchase of a new steam table and additional laptop for Pastor's use were also discussed.


