

Happy Christian New Year, Elim -

It is wonderful to begin this year in a season of Advent when we hope for and expect the most brilliant gift from God!

This year we are embracing the Advent, Christmas and Epiphany seasons with the theme "From Generation to Generation..." which comes to us from



a group of intelligent and purposeful clergy and artisans at "A Sanctified Art". They share this about the origin of our theme:

As we read through and studied the scriptures, a line from Mary's song of protest and praise gave us pause:

Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed; for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name.

His mercy is for those who fear him

His mercy is for those who fear him

from generation to generation.

(Luke 1: 48b-50)

Despite the challenges and vulnerability she faced, Mary could glimpse the scale and scope of the good news she was part of bringing forth. This good news transcends time and space—it was and is bigger than just her. Christ is coming for collective liberation: God's redemption is at work for years to come. Therefore, the promise is meant to be lived out and passed on from generation to generation.

We are invited to look at the characters in our scriptures and wonder: What did each character pass on or contribute? How did each character participate in God's liberation and love? Which characters try to thwart God's justice and what can we learn from them? What is our role now? What is our generation's task? What will we carry forth, and what should we leave behind?

The root word of "generation" is "gen" meaning "origin" or "birth." Our theme is also a call to action: what are we being called to generate or bring forth? What have your ancestors and those who have come before you passed on for you to continue? Who are the spiritual elders in your community who planted the seeds for the things that are now blooming? What seeds are you planting for the future?

From Generation to Generation... reminds us of the ways our lives, histories, actions, and stories are interconnected and woven together. In the midst of narratives, policies, and rhetoric designed to divide us, what does it look like to practice belonging to one another? The work of God is always unfolding— in and through us. This Advent season, how will we carry it forth? May we feel excitement and hopefulness as the work of God flows through us individually and as church together this month.



"DUST OF THE RABBI"

The next Adult Bible Study series written and narrated by Ray Vander Laan will begin in mid-January. The title of this series is "Dust of the Rabbi". Here is a summary of the material this series will present.

Go! And Make Disciples

The mission of God's people has always been to live so that the world would know that their God was the true God. This was true when the Hebrews left Egypt and possessed the Promised Land. This was true during the years of the exile in Babylon. It was true during the time Jesus lived on earth after the Jews had returned to Israel. And it was true for the disciples of Jesus who followed him as their Rabbi and, after his death and resurrection, obeyed his command to go out in to the world and make disciples.

When Jesus came to earth to bring the good news of the kingdom of God and to offer himself as the perfect sacrifice to redeem the whole human race, he also chose disciples who would continue proclaiming his message and making disciples long after he returned to heaven. Jesus selected his disciples from a unique people in a unique place - a four-by-six-mile area on the northwestern shores of the Sea of Galilee. The Jew living in this part of Israel were the most obedient, faithful followers of God to be found. These people knew the Scriptures, they knew how to apply the teaching of Scripture, and they were committed to obeying God in everything every day of their lives. From among them, Jesus chose a handful to carry the new of his kingdom to the world.

To some, Jesus' disciples would seem like an unlikely group. To their world, they weren't the brightest and the best Bible scholars; most of them were fishermen. They didn't know their way around the hug, sophisticated cities of the Roman Empire; they came from small, rural villages. But they had just what Jesus needed the commitment, the passion, the desire to be his *talmudin*. For three and a half years, the disciples walked with Jesus. They followed him everywhere. They did everything they could to learn to be like Jesus – to know and interpret the Scriptures as he did, to pray as he did, to obey God's laws as he did, to love as he did, to proclaim the news of God's kingdom as he did, and to make disciples as he did.

Before he ascended to heaven, Jesus commanded them to go out into the world and make disciples. And they did. One of the places they went was Asia Minor – the sophisticated, prosperous, immoral, perverted, educated, and religious (but pagan) region in the whole Roman Empire! And when the disciples lived out the message of the kingdom of God and made disciples in Asia Minor, it impacted that region like an earthquake. In little more than a century, that region had become predominantly Christian.

In this study, we will investigate the world they went into and how the disciples made such a great impact. This is important to us because our world is much like the world of Asia Minor. If we expect to make the impact the disciples did, then we must learn to be like the – that is, like Jesus.... Our mission as Christians today is the same one God gave to the Israelites when they possessed the Promised Land, the same one Jesus gave to his disciples. We are to love the Lord our God with all our heart, with all our soul, and with all our might, and to love our neighbors as ourselves so that through us the world may know that our God is the one true God.

could use a little extra loving during the holidays with donors who would love to be able to give.


