May the Light of Christ be with you in this season of Epiphany, Elim!

Indeed, this is the season of Epiphany. It begins on January 6 (the twelfth day of Christmas when we think of the Wise Men meeting Jesus) and is celebrated in the church on the first Sunday after January 1. The season lasts until Ash Wednesday which is on February 22 this year.

After wonderful seasons of Advent, Christmas and Christmastide filled with beautiful music, an adorned sanctuary and beloved traditions each Sunday, Epiphany has sometimes felt like a letdown. Maybe 'holding period' is a more accurate description because it has felt like a regrouping period to ready for Lent and Easter.

Last year was the first year I recognized that I had been Epiphany anemic. One might say I had an epiphany about Epiphany! It is a most wonderful Sunday and season for celebrating the Light that Jesus brought into the world! It is a light and joy-filled season! Seeping into many cultures around the world, this is a season of gathering together, eating fun cakes, dancing and giving gifts. This is my kind of season!

This year, however, maybe it feels like we shouldn't celebrate the Light quite as much... There is much grieving... there is worry... there is anxious anticipation for medical procedures to come... there are cancer treatments. There are many tears and much heaviness.

Did you ever sit in a dark room as a kid and create colorful patterns on a Lite-Brite? Have you ever been out to chore so early that dawn hasn't broken and the only light is from your tractor's headlights? Have you ever padded out to the kitchen in the middle of the night to start the turkey baking and the only light comes when you open the oven door? It is in the complete darkness that we recognize the strength of light.

If this is a time when it feels like darkness is surrounding you, it is exactly the right time to celebrate the Light. Indeed, "the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." Perhaps the celebrating involves lighting a candle and thanking God for being with you as you cry. It doesn't have to involve a bunch of people and party food... but it can if that is what feels right as you give thanks to God for the Light you feel with you.

May we notice the small things that are gifts from God in this season. May we notice the big things as well. It is certainly a gift to know God through the Light that Jesus brought into the world. May we celebrate the Light in whatever ways are right for us individually this season. We certainly will as a church as well; I hope you will come to worship on Sundays at 11am.

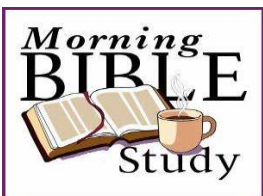
CONGREGATIONAL VOTE FOR SWEDISH SUPPER PROCEEDS

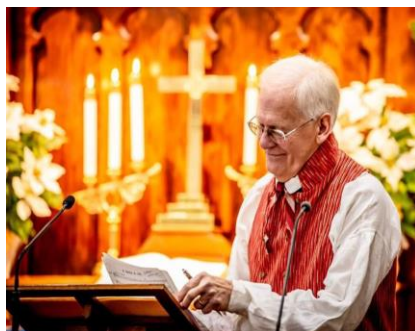

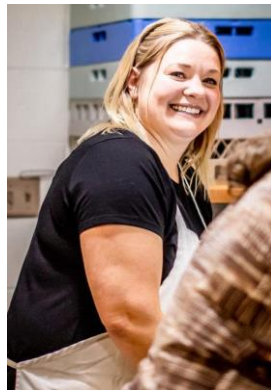
