PERSONAL CARE KIT

Light-weight bath size towel (between 20" x 40" and 52" x 27"), dark color recommended Bath-size bars of soap (8-9 oz.) in original wrapping Adult-size toothbrush (original packaging)
Sturdy comb, remove packaging
Metal nail clipper (with or without attached file), remove packaging

BABY CARE KIT

Lightweight cotton t-shirts (no Onesies)
Long or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (no footies)
Receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with light-weight yarn, 36" – 52" square Cloth diapers, flat fold preferred
Jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with hood, or include baby cap
Pairs of socks
Hand towels, dark color recommended
Bath-size bars of gentle soap (8-9 oz.) in original wrapping; no mini or hotel size bars

Diaper pins or large safety pins

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD SHOEBOX PROJECT

For several years, WELCA has assisted with the Shoebox project sponsored by the Freemount Church. In the past we have asked Elim members to purchase items on a monthly basis for the end- of-year packing. The Youth Group and the Confirmation classes have also helped by packing the Shoeboxes in November to ready them for shipping. The Operation Christmas Child project here in Marquette has moved from the Freemount Lutheran Church to an unused classroom in the former Marquette Elementary School. According to the project leader, Marilyn Spohn, "the new space provides year-round storage for collected items and supplies, and a place to host workdays and packing parties." Elim's WELCA is no longer posting monthly lists of items to purchase, but we still support the project by donating money for supplies and shipping. You are welcome to help in any way you can. Here are some ideas: sewing, cutting material for sewing projects, sorting and organizing items, craft days, writing notes and coloring pictures to go in the boxes, helping with fundraisers or supporting a fundraiser. You can also donate money for the purchase of items, or toward the cost of overseas shipment of the Shoeboxes in November/December. There is a blue-labeled can in the narthex for your donations. Jackie started playing organ for Elim just before her sophomore year on August 1, 1973. Pastor Amy Kay thanked her for all her years of service, not only for playing the organ and piano every Sunday, but also for funerals and weddings, special events, and for accompanying special music <u>and</u> the Senior, Youth and Junior choirs. Jackie has filled in for Choir and Music Director Allan Lindfors for the past 9 months, and has done a wonderful job keeping the music going. Council member Sandy Edwards presented Jackie with a thank you and VISA gift card from the Elim congregation.

Diane Hedberg and Tammy Feil presented Jackie with a giant candy card from the Sunday School children to thank Jackie for accompanying the Junior Choir, and for helping them learn new songs. And last but not least, Allan Lindfors thanked Jackie for all she had done for Elim these many years, and presented her with his gift – a painting of Elim Lutheran Church that he had painted for Pastor Homberg many years ago. The painting had been returned to Allan after Pastor Homberg's death, and because Allan knew how much Pastor Homberg had meant to Jackie, he passed it on to her as a remembrance and a heart-felt thanks. A basket containing thank you cards from church members was also presented to Jackie after the service. THANK YOU, JACKIE FOR ALL YOUR HARD WORK, DEDICATION, AND TALENT. We appreciate you. Below is Jackie's response that she shared with the congregation after the recognition:



Thank you, Elim Lutheran Church, for the special recognition September 10, honoring me as your organist for 50 years. All the cards, gifts and kind words were wonderful and really made me feel special and appreciated. I truly believe you made a BIG deal out of nothing as I am just ONE little speck in a large group of people in this church and in the church worldwide who has chosen to use my God given talent to glorify His name, and it truly isn't work when you use what you've been given, love what you do and are surrounded by the wonderful people of Elim Lutheran Church doing the very same thing, who receive little or no recognition, because they aren't on the payroll. You know who you are, Beth Thomas, Donna Patrick, Sandy Edwards and Dana Olson! I would like to first give thanks and praise to our great God for blessing me with the gift of music. I would like to also thank my parents who paid for piano lessons when the bills were hard to pay and thank you to Vickie Larson Savinski, for being my first piano teacher who I loved and adored and who first introduced me to the joy of music, particularly, the piano and last but not least, thank you to Craig, my partner for 46 years, who sat in the back pew with 3 little kids alone during many worship services. To rewind the years back 50, I do have some memories of the events in my life that led me to this point. In 1973, when I was just 15, the church needed an organist and had been hiring students from Bethany College to fill the position. I guess I have my deceased father-in-law Robert Larson to thank that I am organist at Elim Lutheran Church today. Someone once told me he was on the church council at the time and when they were considering hiring a Bethany College student, he replied, "why would you do that when we have a piano player right here in our church?" Little did he know, if you know how to play the piano, you don't necessarily know anything about the organ but needless to say, I was hired! Janet Sjogren Moore Hosler came to my house one evening and I signed a contract to be your organist on the back porch. No one told me it was forever! I agreed for \$54.17 a month. That was a lot of money back then to a 15 year old farm girl! If I missed a Sunday, my pay was docked \$8.00 and if I missed a choir practice my pay was docked \$4.00. I still have that original contract! I also remember being on the volleyball team with my good friends, Elizabeth Ritter (Ponting) and Cynthia Wickstrom (Hulse). The difference between them and me was they had volleyball talent and I DID NOT! One day it became evident to me that my time would be better spent at church than on the volleyball court, and that I didn't have time for both, so I turned in my uniform and headed for the church. I know I made the right choice for ME to use my God-given talent to glorify God and I challenge each and every one of you to recognize YOUR talent and do the very same thing. God paints every flower a beautiful hue and every life with a beautiful purpose. God has given you SOMETHING you can give back to the world in a way no one else can! It is my prayer you will find and recognize your talents and use them to glorify God and to serve your neighbor. Paul states in Corinthians how God works in different ways in different people, and if everyone pulls

their share of the load, the work gets done. Never forget, it takes us ALL. No one person is more important than another. Helen Keller once said, "Alone we can do so little, Together, we can do so much!" Thank you so much for this kind gesture, honoring me for 50 years on the bench. I am forever grateful to have shared the entire 50 years with a great friend and choir director, Allan Lindfors and the multi -talented people of this small, central Kansas church. However, the true heroes here in our church are those of you who faithfully fill the pews and the choir loft day after day, year after year and have done so for 50 years or more, too! It has been a joy and a pleasure to serve Elim Lutheran Church for 50 years. Thank you from the bottom of my heart, but to God be the Glory, great things HE hath done and will do through us.
