What a fantastic time this is to get to be church, Elim!

We are excited to begin a new year of Children's Sunday School, and the second of two years for our Confirmation Class, starting on September 8! Adult Bible starts up again on September 15. Youth Group will begin meeting weekly on Wednesday evenings starting September 11. Both vocal choirs will begin practicing early this month and will be ready to help lead worship soon. The Women of the ELCA continue to be creative and innovative with their offerings and have numerous events in the works for this fall. The Church Council continues to meet monthly to thoughtfully guide the business and facilities for our congregation. Thanks be to God, we continue to meet weekly for Sunday morning worship at 11am! We are so blessed to get to be a part of this church community!

September 8, the day we begin our Christian Education offerings for the year, is our big "Rally Day". Children are most welcome to bring their backpacks to be blessed for the continuation of their school year during worship. We will also orientate ourselves properly for the year with a day of service. Rightfully, our denomination calls this "God's Work, Our Hands". After worship you are invited to a free light lunch in the Parish Hall and then we will head out into the community to help with a few projects. We will divide up during lunch for projects as we see who is available to serve and what projects we are tackling. Typically our projects last a couple of hours. We might be weeding, cutting down small trees, painting and/or cleaning. One year I forgot my work clothes and cleaned in a dress. It worked, but I wouldn't recommend it. You're most welcome to wear comfortable, chore types of clothes on Rally Day to worship to keep everything as easy as possible.

This month the children (ages 3 – those who haven't started Confirmation) are learning the story of the Samaritan and the hurt man. We hope you will consider bringing your child/grandchild/neighbor kids/whomever! Here is the schedule:

Sept 8 = A teacher from the time of Jesus (full costume, of course) will visit the kids to tell them about the old rules and regulations for who they can be in relationship with and why. They will hear about the Samaritan and the hurt man who broke those rules and how this is a part of the new covenant Jesus made for us with God. The kids will also make friendship bracelets.

Sept 15 = The kids will act out a dramatic detective's scene from the story of the Samaritan and the man who was beaten. It will be recorded and edited in an easy app for them to view.

Sept 22 = The kids will make a clay pendant necklace that connects with the story of the Samaritan and the man who was hurt.

Sept 29 = By now the kids should know the story well so they will be creating contemporary scenes depicting its themes. They will think about how Jesus would want us to act... and will be encouraged to act in those way as his followers.



NOTES FROM CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING

August 5, 2024

Pastor Amy Kay Pavlovich plans to meet with Sunday School teachers and Elim members interested in helping with the new Sunday School format on Monday, August 12. She will explain the lesson plans for September through May, and ask for volunteers to help on selected Sundays. She asked council to consider work projects for "God's Work, Our Hands" on Sept. 8. Council voted to amend the Student Loan Promissory Note to allow \$500 per semester for up to \$1000 per year.

Worship & Music: No report.

Finance & Stewardship: No meeting.

Memorial Committee: No meeting. Funds set aside for parsonage cleaning and upkeep will be used to pay Kassandra

Hernandez for recent cleaning of parsonage.

Christian Ed.: Diane Hedberg reported on the rodeo concession stand hosted by Elim on Aug. 2 & 3. Both nights were busier than in past years, with Saturday night dealing with long lines all evening and selling out by the end of the night. Total profit was \$1463.79, which will be placed in the Special Events Fund. Donations for the Patriotic Breakfast hosted by the Christian Ed. committee will also be placed in the Special Events Fund.

Evangelism/Social Ministry: No meeting. The Elim float in the Marquette Celebration parade won 1st place. The \$25 scrip awarded will be used for church purchases at Piper's. **Property/Security Committee:** No meeting.
