

WELCA will hold a meeting **SUNDAY, February 9 at 8:30 AM** to discuss plans moving forward. Please attend if possible.



Nancy Hopp and Betsy Patrick agreed to serve on the nominating committee so that Julie Olson and Scott Johnson can step down, having served on the committee for a number of years. Holly Toll volunteered to serve on the Audit Committee to replace Sondra Myers, who also has served multiple years. President Curtis Patrick announced the council's approval of a retirement fund for Pastor Amy Kay Pavlovich, which will be established through an existing account with Thrivent. The meeting adjourned following Pastor Amy Kay's prayer at 11:55 AM.

SWEDISH SUPPER 2024

Elim hosted its traditional Swedish Supper on December 4, 2024. Many of the people who attend are from out of town, and they continue to come for the food, entertainment, and socializing. Even though there were approximately 20 less meals served, both on-site and through take-outs, the net proceeds came to \$7,264.53. The total income from supper receipts and food sales was down \$500, but thanks to generous donations given to assist with the higher cost of food supplies, etc., the profit was higher than last year. The proceeds were disbursed to Elim Youth Group for their mission trip, Riverview Estates, and Marquette Learning Center. Each received \$2,421.51. Thank you to all members and community friends who helped out with the Swedish Supper, either by providing food and supplies, preparing the food before and during the supper, entertaining, serving, and cleaning up. And thank you, Linda Johnson, for your countless hours spent organizing and managing this event.

January 13, 2025

The council meeting was delayed one week due to severe weather. Council members approved the retirement fund for Pastor Amy Kay. Council also approved the installation of a new security system to replace the existing less-efficient one. Pastor Amy Kay reported that she will be traveling Feb. 15-27 and has arranged for Ethan Feistner (Bethany Village Chaplain) to fill in for February 16. Gospel Sunday will be held February 23 while she is on vacation. Council also reviewed the annual meeting agenda and the budget proposal for needed changes. The 2025 budget proposal was approved with one addition.
