Greetings in this glorious season of new life -

I'm grateful to have grown up in an involved Christian family and a congregation very similar to Elim. I loved God and loved the church. I got to attend Bethany College. It was here that my understanding widened to another mainline denomination. One could not have asked for a more firm foundation! And yet, when I was in my first year of graduate school at Kansas State University before going to Seminary, I was utterly befuddled at a Bible Study.

David Jones (who could have gone by the deserved titles of "Reverend" or "Doctor", but who invited you to call him David) was my Campus Minister at the Ecumenical Campus Ministry. He led the weekly Bible Study I found so perplexing. It wasn't the scripture that was stunning; it was the reflections of the scripture by another student in the small group that gave me pause. She and I didn't agree on much of anything! I had never experienced such a thing.

As soon as the study ended, I was quick to volunteer to get the snacks from the kitchen. I wanted to get away from that uncomfortable table quickly! I stood up to rush out and only then realized I had no idea where the kitchen was with the snacks. David came to my rescue in more ways than one that day.

Together we started down an ordinary hallway to what would become a kitchen. As soon as I thought we were safely out of earshot of the group, I clumsily blurted that I didn't know why I disagreed with the other student so much. She clearly took her faith seriously and I did too. Why did we feel sideways?!

This day I had ears to hear David: people study the Bible in different ways. Simplified, some study the Bible in its literal sense and others study it contextually. The other student and I grew up studying the Bible in different ways and we continued to do so.

I have no memory of what snacks we retrieved, but I do remember staring at David in the kitchen with a gaping mouth. Whaaaaat? Oh my gosh. So this is why we think differently about tattoos and marriages then! Because some of us read the words at face value for us today and others of us study when it was written, to whom it was written and what else was going on at that time? That's NUTS!

My memory of the conversation isn't as clear when we headed out of the kitchen with a cart full of sugar. I probably asked David how we can solve this problem. He probably chuckled without making me feel stupid. These fundamental differences remain. We people of faith will continue to study the scriptures in different ways which will lead us to think differently about how we live out our faith today.

By the time we got back to the study table, the revelations from the snack run had already helped me. Instead of being as frustrated with the gal, I felt more curious about her. I asked where she was from and the conversation flowed naturally. Before long we were chatting comfortably. When we took a step back from our disagreements, we had common life experiences that were nice to connect. We never saw eye to eye in any Bible Study, but we became friends.

Almost thirty years later David is still teaching me through this memory. I'm still practicing stepping back from disagreements to try to find a thread of common ground. Sometimes I'm better at it than others, but it always feels like the right thing to try to do... what God would want for us. If this rings true to you, I invite you to keep practicing along with me. The table can get more comfortable. I hope. Thanks be that God is with us as we try.

Lastly, this understanding and lessons beyond it are what the Confirmation class has been studying for two years. I'm proud of them. Those who choose to do so will confirm the vows made at their baptisms on Sunday, April 27 during worship. This will be another high, holy day in the church and I hope you are able to take part.

#### NOTES FROM CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING

March 3, 2025

Council approved the Parish Hall roof repair after property committee approval of final bid, and congregational vote held on Sunday, March 2 (see minutes below). The Gathering Table in Kansas City is no longer operating. This was where the noisy offering has been sent for several years. Pastor Amy Kay suggested a different source be selected for each year. For this year, council voted by consensus to send the offering to Guatemala for water filters and stoves to improve health and safety for persons in need. Pastor Amy Kay announced that VBS will be held May 27-30 at Elim Lutheran Church. She also shared survey results on Christmas Eve service and Swedish Supper.

<u>Worship & Music</u>: No report. <u>Finance & Stewardship</u>: No meeting. <u>Memorial Committee</u>: No meeting.

<u>Christian Ed</u>.: Pastor Amy Kay reported Sunday School is "all

good".

Evangelism/Social Ministry: No meeting.

<u>Property/Security Committee</u>: Matt Toll reported that the Property committee approved the estimate of \$28,000 for the Parish Hall roof repair. The Property/Security committee met with Don Fagen with Hopp's Sound to learn about the new security cameras installed in February. Matt reported that the committee will replace the latches on the back door by the bathrooms to ensure it is properly locked.

Next meeting to be held on Monday, April 7, 2025.

A congregational vote was held Sunday, March 2 for approval of roof repair on the Parish Hall, estimated to cost \$26,000-30,000. Council president Curtis Patrick called the meeting to order at 12:00 PM following the worship service. Scott Johnson, chairman of the Property Committee, explained that the PVC vinyl roof was 17 years old. Ryan Roofing has been contacted to take 2 layers off and replace it with a thicker membrane with a 20-year warranty. Mike Hulse moved and Carylee Nelson seconded to approve the repair. The motion passed. Curtis Patrick adjourned the meeting.
