Greetings, Elim members and friends -

Last Sunday, June 22, we woke to the news that our country had bombed Iran's nuclear facilities. For me, it was breathtaking news. I tossed the sermon I thought I would share that morning in the trash and shared these words from Amanda Flayer who is the co-founder of La Puerta Abierta, an amazing school and library in Guatemala:

Last month, I was invited as a guest speaker for a small leadership group of NGO executive directors in Guatemala. The mediator, a wise friend who has dedicated a lifetime to studying development in countries like Guatemala, opened the conversation with the following question:

At a time when current events feel daunting, heavy and unpredictable, where do you find hope?

In the span of one week, Israel has launched missiles into Iran, Russia has bombed a civilian street in the Ukraine, two state lawmakers from Minnesota were gunned down in their homes in a politically motivated assassination attempt.

As I type these words, my heart literally feels too burdened to beat, swelled by tragedy.

I thought of Amanda's words because my heart that morning also felt unable to beat properly, swelled by tragedy.

I went back and reread her message in the early morning hours before worship. Amanda went on to eloquently write about how, over time, she realized that she finds hope in the children of their school. The school itself, La Puerta Abierta, is hope. Community engagement is hope for her.

I posed this question in worship and it is important enough to repeat here: What does hope look like for you?

After worship I stopped by a friend's house. She had gorgeous, huge, yellow lilies blooming like crazy and there were multiple unopened flowers. More brilliant lilies would be emerging to join the already amazing plants! I was stopped in my tracks and realized that this is hope for me.

Later that day I went home to the farm I grew up on. I rode with my niece who expertly picked up loads of wheat with the grain cart from her dad and my brother, on the fly. Watching the two of them harvest such healthy, life-giving grain gave me hope. The wind was blowing (!) and the amber waves of swaying grain were captivating. I sat there on the tractor's surprisingly comfortable side chair and gave thanks to God for all of the many ways I see and feel hope. It doesn't take away all of the suffering near and far of people known and unknown, but it does make living out of joy with hope possible amidst it all. I hope the same for you all, Elim.

I asked Ava what inspired her to create this beautiful painting. She said she did a lot of research about the Pentecost. Most of all, she wanted to incorporate the dove and use warm colors to represent the Holy Spirit. Originally, the confirmands were going to help paint the design Ava had sketched out on the poster paper, but it was too hard to find times that worked out for everyone, so Ava gladly completed it herself.
